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Superintendent Dale Hogie Named Administrator of Excellence

(St. Paul, MN) – The Minnesota Association of School Administrators (MASA) has named Dale Hogie, Superintendent at Lake Park Audubon School District, as a 2016 Administrator of Excellence. Hogie has received this award in recognition of his leadership, concern for students, and active involvement in professional and community affairs. Hogie was honored for the Administrator of Excellence Award at a statewide recognition ceremony during the MASA/MASE Spring Conference, March 10-11, 2016, at the Minneapolis Marriott Northwest, Brooklyn Park.

Hogie's achievements reflect his ability to lead important changes in the educational system. As a superintendent in North Dakota, he facilitated the consolidation of two school districts. In Lake Park Audubon School District, he led the campaign to pass a significant seven-year operating levy and a \$21 million building bond referendum. In addition, the district was awarded a \$17.35 million Qualified School Construction Bond and a \$1.69 million Qualified Zone Academy Bond in March 2010.

Hogie has been an active MASA member for 13 years. He is also a member of the Minnesota Rural Education Association, Lakes Country Administrators, Lake Park Audubon Legacy Foundation, Lake Park Audubon Booster Club, Lake Park Audubon Community Education Committee, and the Becker County Children's Initiative.

Hogie holds specialist and master's degrees in education administration from North Dakota State University in Fargo. He earned a bachelor's degree in business education and physical education from Valley City State University in Valley City, North Dakota.

Each year, MASA recognizes members for their contribution to public education. MASA is a professional organization of Minnesota's school leaders whose members include over 900 public education and non-public superintendents, directors of special education, curriculum and technology leaders, other central office administrators, service providers, business partners and retirees.

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
