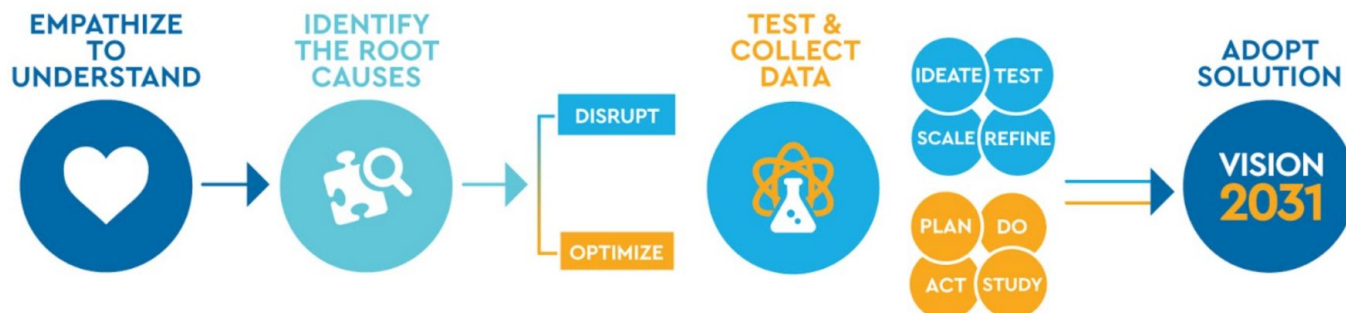

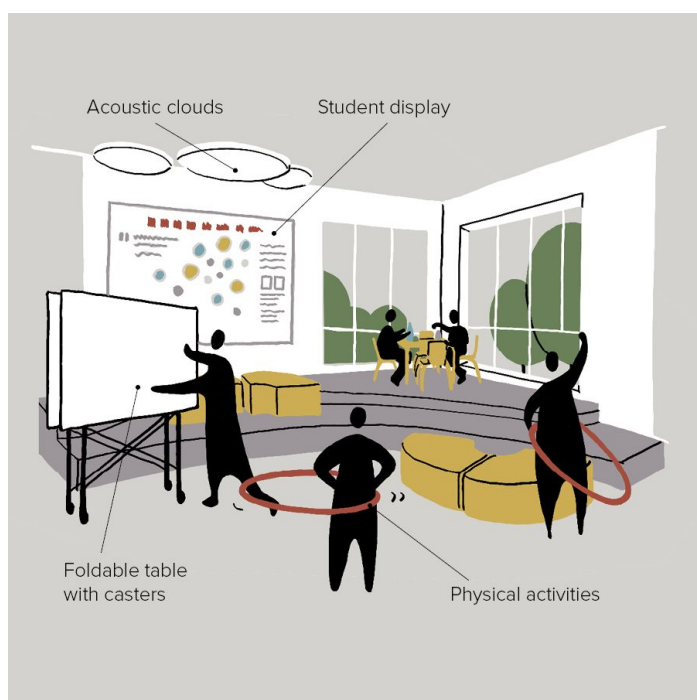


What does designing for equity actually look like?

Dr. Rhoda Mhiripiri-Reed strives to transform students' lives through improved public education. After graduating from Yale with a teaching license, she taught in Saint Paul, served as an assistant principal at her alma mater Bloomington Kennedy, and then was a high school principal in Anoka-Hennepin. While a graduate student at Harvard, she completed a doctoral residency with D.C. Public Schools, building an 18-month principal training program. She then served as Associate Superintendent in the Monterey Peninsula Unified District in California. Mhiripiri-Reed has been Hopkins Public Schools' superintendent since 2017. Under her leadership, Hopkins created a bold plan to go from great to world class through a community informed strategic plan. Hopkins' bold vision, Vision 2031, promises to reimagine Hopkins Public Schools from the ground up.



Ann Ertl has been in education for twenty years. For most of those years, her primary focus was as an English language teacher, both with adults and K-12 students and then later as a district EL coordinator. As an independent EL consultant, Ann also had the chance to work with districts across the Twin Cities metro area and throughout the midwest on district improvement planning focused on English Learners. Ann currently serves as the Director of the Innovation, Design & Learning team for Hopkins Public Schools and is pursuing her doctorate degree in education with a focus on organizational theory.



Randy Fielding is an architect and founding partner at Fielding International, an interdisciplinary architecture and education firm that designs schools where learners thrive. As a champion for the firm's mission, Randy serves as a thought leader, learning collaborator, and design mentor. His work, which extends from early childhood to higher education and across 50 countries, has earned eighteen international design awards, including the top two awards from the Association for Learning Environments: Planner of the Year and the MacConnell Award. Randy has developed an open source system of 70 design patterns that nurture belonging, collaboration and creativity that are available to all at schoolpatterns.com
